Worldview

- The total set of beliefs a person has about life's biggest questions.
- A pattern of beliefs, convictions, and habits that help us make sense of God and the world

Religion

Attempts to explain what the world is like and how we should live

Closed System

- The world is only material; there is nothing transcendent or supernatural
- There is no reality beyond what we can sense

Open System

- There is a transcendent being that acts on the world
- There is a reality beyond what we can sense

Truth

■ Conformity to fact or reality

Discernment

- The ability to distinguish mentally
- To see or recognize

Atheism

The belief that no god exists, either outside the universe or in it.




Pantheism

The belief that God is the universe. The creator and the creation are two different ways of viewing the same thing.

The belief in a transcendent God who created the world





How can the world be fixed?




Eternity

Pantheism: live a cycle of suffering and rebirth to achieve enlightenment and be free from suffering





People make sense of the world by developing ideas

These ideas become worldviews

These values lead to certain habits that affect the way we live

Our worldviews lead us to value certain things

There are four tests for evaluating the truth of a worldview

- The test of reason: Is it reasonable? Can it be logically stated and defended?
- The test of the outer world: Is there some external evidence supporting it?
- The test of the inner world: Does it adequately address your personal experiences in our everyday world?
- The test of the real world: Are its consequences good or bad when applied to a given cultural context?
