- What three commands did God give man?
- How did God describe all He had made?

<u>Atheism</u>

- Secular Humanism: atheistic and materialistic worldview that advocates a society free from religion; humans determine truth and value
- Postmodernism: a skeptical worldview that teaches ultimate reality is unknowable and a knowledge is a social construct
- *Marxism*: atheistic and materialistic worldview that promotes abolition of private property and ownership of production by the state

Pantheism

- **Buddhism**: more of a way of life than an organized belief; its goal is enlightenment based on the four noble truths
- *Hinduism*: a syncretic religion that believes God is in everything, reality is an illusion, and people undergo karma to unify with the Braham
- New Age: teaches that everyone and everything are connected through a divine conciousness

Theism

- Christianity: a theistic worldview centered on the person of Jesus Christ and based on the teachings of the Holy Bible
- Judaism: theistic worldview based on the Old Testament Scriptures and focuses more on this life than the life to come
- *Islam*: theistic worldview centered on the life of Mohammed and bases its belief on the teachings of the Quran, Hadith, and Sunnah

How do we know what is actually true?

- Remember the definition of truth:
- Conformity to fact or reality

<u>Discernment</u>

- The ability to distinguish mentally
- To see different things and put them into their proper context to evaluate truth claims using correct thinking and logic
