

WORLDVIEW

The total set of beliefs a person has about life's biggest questions. (Jonathan Morrow)

A pattern of beliefs, convictions, and habits that help us make sense of God and the world

HOW DOES NEW AGE ANSWER THE FOUR BIG QUESTIONS?

- Creation: I have always been; I am an expression of consciousness
- Fall: humans have failed to understand true consciousness
- Redemption: Humans must have indifference to suffering and live the cycle of reincarnation
- **Eternity:** we go on to our next life to relieve our journey of suffering. This is sometimes called nirvana or stream of consciousness.

- 1. Everything is consciousness
 - consciousness is usually defined in vague terms
 - often defined as personal attributes such as peaceful, selfsufficient, blissful, knowing, whole
 - consciousness is an impersonal force

*God is not an impersonal force; Exodus 3:14, Acts 17:24-25

- 2. Every person is God
 - all is consciousness and all humans and things are part of this consciousness
 - this "god" is actually a force
 - "I am god, you are god, every person is god"

*This idea of "god" is vastly different from the Creator God who made us and desires a personal relationship with us!

- 3. Consciousness can be harnessed to achieve perfection
 - everything is energy; thoughts are energy
 - good thoughts produce good energy, bad thoughts produce bad energy
 - NS believes Jesus was human who achieved perfection and godhead

John 14:23 reminds us that Jesus is God; he was not a human who simply achieved perfection


- 4. The purpose of life is overcoming self
 - we must be lost in the universal self in order to have meaning
- We free ourselves from self (selfishness and ego) through reincarnation
- reincarnation is the process by which the body passes away but the soul continues its quest for enlightenment

How is the idea of reincarnation different from Christianity?

THE FOUR BIG QUESTIONS

- Creation: I have always been; I am going through a cycle of karma. The physical world was not created; it is an illusion
- Fall: Human sin is caused by ignorance of Oneness. Evil comes from failure to realize that what is seen is an illusion.
- <u>Redemption</u>: one must detach oneself from passion in action. One can burn off negative karma by work with a satgura (an advanced spiritual teacher)
- Eternity: The goal of life is liberation from samsara (the cycle of rebirths).

 Liberation can't be achieved unless a person rises above the law of karma.



THE FOUR BIG QUESTIONS: BUDDHISM

- Creation: I have always been; I am going through a cycle of karma.

 The physical world was not created; it is an illusion
- <u>Fall</u>: Mara is the force of desire in the world, the root of all suffering. Dukkha (illusion) is the cause of suffering.
- Redemption: one must realize everything is an illusion and suffering comes from your desires produced by illusion. You must follow the eightfold path
 - Eternity: achieve enlightenment and escape earthly desires; nirvana

FOUR NOBLE TRUTHS OF BUDDHISM

- Existence is suffering and illusion
- Suffering is caused by earthly desires
- It is possible to escape earthly desires in nirvana
- To realize nirvana, one must follow the Eightfold Path.
