



### 2 CATEGORIES OF ETHICS


- 1. Teleological theories: (What is the good life?)
  Teleological theories judge actions as right or wrong by their end results.
  - Example: abortion will lead to a better life in the future
  - Example: Divorce will help spouses end a difficult marriage


### ARISTIPPUS: HEDONISM

**JEREMY BENTHAM:** UTMHAT IS ethical is to pursue the greatest good for the greatest number of people







MILL: ETHICAL LIBERTARIANISM

EXISTENTIALISM


Since we create our own meaning, we ought to do whatever helps us become our most authentic selves.

### 2 CATEGORIES OF ETHICS

- **2.** Deontological theories: (What ought we to do?) We ought to do what is right because it is the right thing to do. It rests on the belief that there is absolute truth.
  - Example: Jean Valjean confessing to his guilt
  - Example: Returning money you found

**IMMANUEL KANT:** TRANSCENDENTAL ORFALISM as humans is to figure out what is good without qualification and then pursue it.



RENE DESCARTES:
RATIONALISM
as thinking beings, so we must use our reasoning ability to live virtuously
