
PHILOSOPHY: 3 KEY QUESTIONS

- What is ultimately real? (Metaphysics)
- What does it mean to know? (Epistemology)
- With what part of our being do we contemplate these questions? (Mind/body problem)

- Metaphysics: Beyond the natural things
- Epistemology: the study of knowledge
- Monists: only one reality exists (body or soul)
- Dualists: there are two natures of reality (body and soul)

FRANCIS BACON

"A little philosophy inclines man's mind to atheism, but depth in philosophy brings men's minds about to religion"



- What we can know is actually there
- Reality exists for us to know. We can train ourselves to know things because they actually exist.
- This is called realism

- Metaphysics: The Creator-God is behind the universe's reality, meaning, and purpose
- Without the Logos, there would be no cosmos
- Creation is intelligible because God is intelligent

 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by Him; and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life; and the life was the light of men.

FAITH

"Christians begin with faith in the Creator and Savior; that faith is then backed up with evidence!"

- Epistemology: we can know truth because order has been made known through Jesus Christ, the incarnation of the Logos
- Knowledge gained by faith is backed up by knowledge gained by careful, logical investigation.

Mind/body problem: Human beings are composed of immaterial minds and material bodies
